The subject matter is up to you but keep in mind that the admissions committee will be seeking a sense of you as a person and also as a potential student and graduate of the UND School of Law. We encourage you to develop a statement that provides the Committee with insights that cannot be obtained from the CAS report or other information contained on the application. You may include information addressing any economic, cultural, and/or societal factors, your academic record, or LSAT results, which would provide the Admissions Committee with additional insight into your application.
