



Housing Options

UND On-campus options – If you want to reside right on the main campus, this site will allow you to look at options and apply for housing.

Students can choose between residence halls or apartments. Squires Hall is for returning students only (so would not be an option for the first year) and Hancock Hall is for graduate and 21+ students only. University Place is counted as a residence hall but is an apartment-style building.

Students can stay on campus over Winter and Spring Breaks free of additional charge. Meal plans remain active over those breaks. During the summer, students can live on campus without being enrolled in Summer classes as long as they are enrolled in classes for the following Fall semester for a cost.

All residence halls (including University Place) require a meal plan for the entire academic year. Students living in apartments are not required to have a meal plan.

Off-campus options – Rent College Pads is the official off-campus housing platform of UND. You can filter housing options around Grand Forks in a variety of ways, compare pricing and see how far of a drive any building is from various points on campus.
